Meeting called to Order at 5:00 PM, by Bettina Schmidt

1. Approval of Minutes $-\frac{11}{07}/21$ and $\frac{11}{29}/21$

- 2. Old County and Mountain Roads project/319 Grant Highway DEFER, B Johnson not available
- 3. Union Rd project Notice of Award Documents related to the Union Road Improvement Project provided by PVPC, reviewed

- 4. Update on Sichol land purchase/Steven's Brook project
 - a. 8th amendment for P&S to extend closing date from 11/30/2021 to 03/31/2022 executed
 - b. Title examiner assigned, no closing date yet
 - c. Sen Fattman's office is looking onto if/how they may be able to help move things forward
 - d. State and Federal grants had already been extended into 2022
- 5. Bylaw project with General Code
 - a. Started in 2019 but delayed due to multiple reasons; Town Clerk working with Attorney General office to continue work
 - b. Scope is adoptions through 2017; they have asked for info from through May 2020 (additional fee may apply)
 - c. Organizational Analysis document reviewed; was originally due 4/17/2020 but extended; Decisions needed:
 - i. Include any adoptions from 2019 and 2020 Town Meetings
 - ii. Table of Contents as submitted
 - iii. Style conventions as noted
 - iv. Method of Adoption options
 - 1. Accept renumbering only typically selected if reorganizing bylaws
 - Readopt bylaws in their entirety typically selected if substantive changes; results in new set of Bylaws that replaces all previous; requires complete review by Attorney General

- 3. Separate warrant articles for specific changes typically selected if few and/or non-substantive changes
- 4. Adoption with reference to red-line version highlights all changes including typo corrections; cumbersome to present at Town Meeting due to hundreds of pages and combination of minor and major changes
- v. Code Adoption Cost estimate for regulations and General Law acceptances/Special Acts
- vi. Bylaw numbering must be approved by Planning Board

Motion120703 to include 2019 and 2020 in analysis, accept table of contents as submitted, accept style conventions as noted, Option 4 Red-lined method of adoption and request an estimate to include mentioned decisions in the codification project made by B Schmidt, 2nd by C Johnson, All in favor Yes

6. Select Board and Finance Board joint meetings

 - iii. Lake preservation

- a. J Whalen sent email out to boards and departments requesting input on possible qualifying projects/expenses; compiled results in spreadsheet (reviewed)
- b. Holland has been allocated approx.. \$241,000
- c. Towns that do not provide public sewer and/or water have very limited eligibility

Walk-in: Ron Seaburg of 110 E Brimfield Rd. - came to meeting expecting sign-off of business licenses; Chair explained Select Board only signs liquor licenses, timing is the last meeting in November; many years back business licenses were also granted through Select Board; that is not required by MGL and hasn't been done by SB in 6 years or longer; Mr. Seaburg expressed concern over expansion of operations occurring at Howlett property; trucks entering and various disruptive activity occurring at all hours, including overnight; it is recommended that Mr. Seaburg (member of Zoning Board of Appeals) consult Zoning bylaws to identify any potential infractions, including noise violations; questions on intent of rural business classification and on operation application requirements; Chair indicated we will look into this
